## Researching Locations

  - o BML reservable sites

## Reservation Methods

- Reservable online
  - Recreation.gov, ReserveCalifornia.com
  - Bring printed confirmation
- Walk-in Campgrounds
  - Pay **cash** at pay station, usually near entrance
  - Nat'l Parks, etc. often have some sites set aside as walk-in
  - Know other campgrounds in area in case it's full
- Dispersed Camping
  - No officially designated sites
  - Usually no fees

## Dispersed Camping

- Most undeveloped public lands available
  - Camping cannot interfere with other uses
  - o <a href="https://freecampsites.net">https://freecampsites.net</a>
- No amenities
  - Bring water
  - No bathrooms
  - Pack out trash
- Pick a low-impact site
  - Applies to all types of campgrounds
  - Use a location that has been camped in before
  - Avoid disturbing vegetation, etc.
  - Consider **LNT** principles
- Find specific rules and regulations for an area before you go
  - NFS/BLM website, contact NFS/BLM office

## Other Considerations

- Check nearby services
  - o Closest gas?
  - Cell service?Don't rely on it even if you expect to have it.
  - Emergency services?Is there a campground host?Ranger station? Emergency room?
- Check campsite ammenities
  - o Water?
  - o Bathrooms?
- Expected road conditions?
  - Dispersed camping may have poor roads
  - Know what your vehicle is capable of and don't push it
  - Getting stuck will be expensive and could be dangerous

# Getting Gear



## Basic Gear List adapted from REI's Camping Checklist

### Campsite tent sleeping bag (down is great) sleeping pad headlamp/flashlight/lantern camp chairs Tools rope/paracord multi-tool/knife duct tape small broom/dustpan mallet/hammer/axe

#### Health

- first aid kit
- toiletry kit
- hand sanitizer
- toilet paper
- sun protection
- insect repellent

#### Clothes

- layers
- more layers
- **a** raingear
- camp shoes





## Food

### Equiptment

- stove and fuel
- lighter
- pots/pans/utensils
- □ cups/mugs
- mess kits
- cutting board
- cooler, ice
- trash bags
- paper towels
- camp suds

### Meal Ideas

- instant oats
- pita & hummus
- pasta/mac n cheese
- burgers/hot dogs
- chili
- soft tacos
- rice+bean burritos

One-pot, minimal clean-up meals are best

## Where to Buy

- Retailers
  - **REI** Store-brand and name brand gear from entry-level to top-of-the-line. \$20 lifetime membership for 10% off, access to additional sales
  - Most gear companies are consumer and environmentally friendly; long return/replace windows, sustainably sourced materials
  - Amazon / Walmart / Target Cheaper gear, range in quality, can lack consumer and environmental guarantees of other brands; good for occasional use/trying out camping
- Outlet stores & used gear stores
  - o REI Outlet & REI Good & Used Deals on previous-season and used gear
  - Manufacturer Outlets & Used stores
- Gear swap and selling groups
  - Facebook Marketplace





# Being Safe & Responsible



## Campfire Safety

- Check regulations before you go
  - <u>Campfire permit</u> needed to operate fires and stoves on public lands
- Fire safety
  - Never leave a fire unattended
  - O Have a shovel and bucket of water to extinguish the fire before you start making it
  - Clear the area around the firepit; fire must always be build in a safe firepit
  - Keep fires small; flames should not be taller than the firepit is wide
  - O Don't leave until the coals are cold enough to touch
- Environmental considerations
  - O Burn wood where you buy it
    - Prevents the spread of pests and diseases
    - Check regulations about gathering firewood; never collect firewood from living trees
  - Use existing fire pits; don't build your own



## Handling Food & Waste

- Secure your food
  - Many developed campsites offer animal-proof storage
  - O Bears break into vehicles, open coolers
- Be prepared to pack all trash out
  - If dumpsters/trash cans are full, don't leave trash next to them
  - Bring plenty of trash bags
  - Secure trash with your food
- Human waste
  - O Pit toilets: **only** toilet paper and human waste
  - No toilets: bury waste/TP 6" deep, at least 200' from water, away from campsites
  - Go before you go





## Be Considerate of Others

- Be mindful of noise
  - Respect posted quiet hours in campgrounds
  - Other people probably don't want to hear your music in camp; keep volume down
  - Don't bring bluetooth speakers on hiking trails
- Dogs
  - We love them, but they aren't wildlife
  - Research dog restrictions before you go
- Reduce environmental impacts
  - The outdoors is a shared resource
  - Leave your campsite better than you found it
